Senior Class News

The senior class are recently back from their school camp at the Dryandra Woodlands, where we stayed at the Lion's Village with our friends Yealering Primary School. Everyone had a fantastic and memorable time participating in team-building exercises through a treasure hunt, nature scavenger hunt to see local flora and fauna, outdoor adventures at Barna Mia, on the playground and bushwalking the Old Mill Trail, and fun and games with our friends.

It was wonderful to see our kind students helping the younger students make their bed and organise their belongings. During meal times the two schools mingled and made the dining hall look like a restaurant of friends catching up. During their free time new games were invented in the bushland in front of our cabins, some students playing chasy games, some built a fort of branches and some looked for numbats. We were very lucky to spot the albino kangaroos in the paddock at the village and later on our bushwalk as well as many beautiful birds.

It was fantastic to see our two schools bond with their peers, develop new skills, and create lasting memories. They are all looking forward to seeing each other again as we train for the Small School Athletics carnival, where our schools are participating in a combined school team.

We are encouraging the students to carry the lessons and experiences from the camp into their daily lives and apply the teamwork, leadership, and problem-solving skills they acquired as we return to our regular school routine. Below are the subjects being covered this term so you can ask your child about their learning experiences.













This term our learning area topics are:

Reading:

Our two reading groups are completing novel studies. Our focus novels are Holes by Louis Sachar and Flat Stanley by Geoff Brown. These units cover vocabulary, grammar, comprehension and reading strategies.

Writing:

We are polishing our recount writing skills and covering poetry, and information report writing. Our super focus is improving our sentence writing, paragraphing and notetaking skills.

Mathematics:

This term is all about the Number Strand, addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. These skills will be developed through exciting hands on learning using our Top Ten mathematics programme designed by Australian Mathematics Teachers.

HASS:

We are examining the Biomes of the World and Australia in Geography. The information we find will then be used in our writing programme.

Science:

It is Biology term. Biology is often taught in term 3 as we see the most changes in the weather and life cycles. We are looking at growing systems and how they work together through permaculture.

Music:

Aloha! We are learning how to play the ukulele! The students had previously purchased their instruments and it's time to learn some tunes.

Library:

Is on a Monday. Last term we won the competition for remembering our books the most days, we hope to win again. As we are Senior class students we need to be reading a variety of fiction and non-fiction books and novels. This is how students are exposed to complex sentences and new vocabulary. The student's diaries are checked each day to see if they are completing their home reading.



Ingredients

Olive oil spray 1 tsp olive oil 3 spring onions, finely sliced ¼ small red capsicum, finely diced 1½ cups self-raising flour ½ cup reduced-fat milk 1 egg, beaten 1 tbsp margarine, melted 1 zucchini, grated & liquid squeezed out 1 220g tin reduced-salt baked beans ⅓ cup reduced-fat tasty cheese, grated



Method

Preheat oven to 180°C. Spray a mini muffin tin with oil or line with paper cases.

Heat oil in a small non-stick pan, add the spring onion and capsicum and cook for 2 minutes, or until the vegetables have softened. Remove from heat and drain on absorbent paper.

Sift the self-raising flour into a large bowl. Make a well in the centre and gradually pour in the milk, egg and margarine while mixing gently. Fold in the onion mix, zucchini, baked beans and cheese until just combined.

Spoon into the muffin tin and bake for 12-15 minutes until cooked through and golden. Cool on a cake rack.

Try making these muffins with other veges you have on hand eg swap grated carrot for the zucchini or some corn kernels for the capsicum.
