It's been a busy and exciting term in the Senior Room, filled with hands-on learning, creativity, and plenty of fun!

In **Science**, we've explored electrical circuits, light, and forces through engaging experiments and investigations. In **HASS**, we deepened our understanding of First Nations peoples and cultures, making meaningful connections across learning areas.

Maths has seen us tackling addition and subtraction using a range of strategies and learning which ones suit us best. We've also explored mapping, negative numbers, and some geometry.

In **English**, we researched and wrote information reports on topics that sparked our curiosity, learning lots of fascinating facts along the way. We've also been developing our watercolour techniques and rehearsing enthusiastically for our upcoming class performance.

We wrapped up the term with a vibrant Indonesian performance and a thoughtful NAIDOC presentation by SIDE, both of which helped us celebrate and reflect on cultural diversity and inclusion.

The Library Lowdown




