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Junior Science

The Sun, Moon and Earth

We have been learning about how the force of gravity causes the Moon to orbit the Earth. This is because the object in orbit will always be much smaller than what it is orbiting. This is because the larger object has more gravitational pull. This is also why the Earth moves around the Sun.


With everything spinning, orbiting and revolving we have to make sure we do not get dizzy with information overload. Using the models, we made have helped us by moving them around in an orbital pattern. We also walked around in an orbital pattern and used torches to investigate how night and day and seasons are all part of our movement in Space.

Senior Science

We have continued to explore the layers of the Sun and how the Sun's fuel is made and turned into heat and light. We have been creating Scientific descriptions about each layer of the Sun. This will be used on a colour coded key to match our 3D model of the Sun's layers.

We started by researching the Greek and Latin origin of the names given for each layer of the Sun. For example, the outer layer of the Sun is the Coronas which means crown of light. This explains the beams of light that come from the Sun. We then researched the scientific description of each layer. We are now finishing a scientific description on each layer in our own words. We look forward to displaying them next to our 3D models.


3D model update. The modelling clay we used has reacted with the heat and styrofoam and has melted and become gooey. We will make another model next week with different materials and keep our fingers crossed.
