Report

We have begun to prepare our Term 4 mural for our dinosaur theme. The students are busy knotting, weaving and painting for their background. We are looking at Australian fossils.

Joel Reid and Rhian brought in some interesting items for Show and Tell, this week. Joel brought in a Lego truck that he has made

with a winding winch and a hook.



Rhian brought in a coloured board that she made from recycled chocolate wrappers. Great work, Rhian. You are thinking about our environment.

In senior room maths, we are learning about symmetry. We tuned into ABCs eco maths with Costa and Dirt Girl. They showed us how to investigate symmetry in nature. Some examples of natural symmetry are flowers, butterflies and spider webs. To continue our investigation we built our own spider webs, making many discoveries and connections between 3D shapes and identifying symmetry.

In junior room science our theme is our place in space. This will be a multi level program that will cover the solar system, orbital patterns, weather and seasons and a deeper investigation into Mars. So far we have made a model of the Solar System and the Earth, Moon and Sun.

In Senior Science we are studying the planets in our solar system briefly, investigating the layers of the sun and how it creates its power. We will then move on to our night sky and how to locate constellations in the southern hemisphere.






The Library Lowdown
