### **Junior Room**

Our Kindy and Pre-Primary students have had a wonderfully busy and productive term, filled with hands-on learning, curiosity, and creativity.

In Literacy, students have been consolidating their knowledge of letters and sounds, building confidence in recognising and using them during reading, writing, and play-based activities. In Mathematics, they have been exploring numbers to 20 and practising adding numbers together up to 10.

Our Chemical Science unit has sparked lots of questions as students investigate what everyday objects are made of and why certain materials are used. They have become little scientists, exploring textures, properties, and simple experiments to build their understanding of the material world.

In Geography, students have been reading and creating maps, learning about different places and their significance. Through stories and hands-on mapping tasks, they are beginning to see how the world around them is organised and why places matter.

Digital Technology has been a big hit this term, with students using Blue Bots and Osmo Awbie to learn sequencing and early coding skills. They have been developing problem-solving strategies, teamwork, and a strong sense of digital curiosity.

In Health, we've been learning about the human body, and its systems. We have also continued our important lessons in protective behaviours, helping students build confidence in personal safety and emotional understanding.

A highlight of the term has been learning even more AUSLAN signs, which students now confidently use during class routines and songs. Their enthusiasm for signing has been wonderful to watch.

We also enjoyed welcoming our new Kindy students for 2026 during our Kindy Transition Day. The children joined us for fun, themed activities including a Teddy Bears' Picnic and Summer at the Beach play sessions. It was a lovely opportunity for our incoming students to meet classmates, explore the classroom environment, and begin feeling comfortable and excited about starting school next year.

We are also very excited as we prepare for our end-of-year performance of "A Squash and a Squeeze" and our Christmas Lights Whole School AUSLAN song and cannot wait to share their hard work with families on Presentation Night.




